Can you believe Easter is only days away! I'm looking forward to the Resurrection Celebration we have planned for you and the friends you'll bring with you this year. It will be glorious. Whether it's a small group of people gathered to sing a cappella outdoors or a feast of music and prayer indoors – the Resurrection of Christ is always magnificent to behold. The promise of eternity with Christ is always before us. The message Jesus Christ offers is hope that we were made for more than "the good life." God created us for the BETTER life! A life that begins now and extends to the end of time. Will you help us prepare for Easter?

1. Invite your friends! Invite strangers!

It is written through the lens of John 15:13. With 7 songs of varying styles, this cantata presents the Easter story with songs that lead us through the events of Holy Week to the triumphant resurrection.

- "Sonrise" Service will be held at 7:00 am in the South Parking lot.
- Easter Services will be held at 8:30 & 10:45 am in the Sanctuary and HUB.
- Sunday School will be available at 9:45 am.

3. Help out in any way that you can.

If you see ANYTHING that needs to be done - a piece of paper that needs to be picked up, a person who needs a question answered - I encourage you to "just do it." Most importantly, if you see someone 'new' in the crowd offer them a smile, a kind word, a seat near you. You could be the reason a guest returns next week.

Just think of it: because of Easter our past is forgiven, our life is worth living and we have a future in heaven! Romans 3:22 says, "We are made right in God's sight when we trust in Jesus Christ to take away our sins. And we all can be saved in this same way, no matter who we are or what we have done (NLT)."

SERVING MINISTRIES

Serving Ministries is hard at work reaching out to our community in several different ways.

On February 29 our church received a request from the Azle Church of Christ for supplies for the firefighters in the Texas Panhandle. On Monday, March 4 the church office received a







call from the Church of Christ saying that the First Methodist Church of Azle provided more supplies than any other organization. Thanks to everyone who donated. During this phone call, we were provided with a list of tools that the firefighters needed. Serving Ministries purchased 5 flat shovels, 5 spade shovels, 5 rakes, 9 pairs of leather gloves, and 3 large trash bags. Thanks to Azle Ace Hardware for giving us a 20% to 50% discount on our purchases.

I spoke with the Azle Community Caring Center, and they need canned vegetables and canned soups. They are completely out of these items. They have not been able to get these items from the Tarrant Area Food Bank in a while.

The Good N.E.W.S. needs paper towels, dishwashing liquid, toilet paper, and resealable bags, of any size. Items for the Caring Center and Good N.E.W.S. can be placed in the shopping cart or containers between the doors at the covered portico entrance.

The spring Good Neighbor Blitz is on April 12 and 13. The Good Neighbor Blitz is a two-day event where the City of Azle and Servolution join to organize contractors and volunteers to do repair work on homes where the owner is unable to do the repairs. The recipients of this program do have to qualify for the help. When it is closer to the date, I will post information about the home we will be working on. All Skill levels are needed.



The Community Garden has a few boxes already rented. If you are interested in renting a box, please contact the church office. We are

looking for someone to take over the position of garden coordinator and operator. Karl and Farrah Schluter have done a wonderful job, but other commitments are making it so they are unable to do it this year. If you, or someone you know, is interested in this position please call Deanna Keen or the church office.

WOMEN'S HAND QUILTING

Prayer is a powerful tool that God has provided for us. But can you touch a prayer? Can you pull it close and feel its love and comfort? How many times has someone said, "I'll keep you in my prayers," and you wonder if they did? Well, you can answer these questions with a definite "Yes!" if it is part of a Prayer Quilt.

The purpose of a Prayer Quilt Ministry is not to make and distribute quilts but to promote prayer using quilts. It is not just the gift of a quilt – it is a gift of love and prayer; the quilt is simply the "prayer carrier." It is a statement of faith in God and His power to comfort, strengthen, and heal. As a special gift of love, quilts are made for anyone facing health problems or personal crises. Each quilt is made for someone in special need of prayer.

The History A few ladies started an informal quilting group in 1992 at Hope United Methodist Church in Ranch Bernardo, CA. Their only purpose was to have fun making quilts together. Then, a group member's 2-year-old grandson Kody ended up in a coma following heart surgery. His doctors were very pessimistic about his chances of recovery. The ladies decided to make a quilt in vivid primary colors. With no time to quilt it, the layers were tied together as silent prayers were said for Kody. "There must be a prayer tied with each knot," someone remarked. The group's first prayer quilt was rushed to the hospital that night.

Even before he was fully conscious, Kody's little hands were touching the knots on his quilt. After coming out of the coma, the quilt became so important to his recovery that the doctors wrote in his medical chart that the quilt was not to leave his side! Through several subsequent surgeries, whenever he needed another needle stick or scary test, that quilt was right with him, providing comfort and strength for many years before his sudden death at the age of 14.

The Birth of a Ministry During Kody's long hospital stay, parents of other children were asking where they could get prayer quilts for their sick little ones. The quilting ladies realized they had more work to do! To involve as many people as possible in the prayer process, they began to bring the quilts to Sunday services and invite the entire congregation to participate in praying and tying the knots. As a result, more prayer quilt requests came in. What had begun as a small project had grown into an active Outreach Ministry at Hope UMC.

The goal is to encourage and involve as many people as possible to participate in the prayer effort, not merely to make and give away quilts. *Each knot tied on a quilt represents a prayer.* Prayer Quilts are never sold; they are a gift.

Of **utmost importance** is the prayer support of the congregation. Prayer Quilts are given to those who have physical, emotional, or spiritual prayer needs. They are available to anyone in need of prayer; God's love and grace is available to all.

FMC Azle is home to the Women's Hands Prayer Quilt Ministry. Prayer Quilts are made by individuals in the congregation. Upon request, prayer quilts are first prayed over by the congregation and then delivered to someone in need of prayer. Anyone can request a Prayer Quilt for a friend or loved one in need of prayer from our local Women's Hands Prayer Quilt Ministry.

Our latest quilt ministry project at FMC Azle is to provide baby quilts to JPS here in Azle. It is an honor to provide these quilts through the







church and we want to allow others to also make these quilts. To do that, we will be meeting at the church on the third Wednesday of each month from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm (feel free to bring a sack lunch with you). We have supplies to make a quilt and lots of space, but sewers will need to bring their sewing machine. If you are not a sewer but would like to help, we could use people to press the material and blocks as the quilt tops are made, or just come for the fellowship! If you have cotton material or thread to donate, bring that too.

This may be slow to take off, but this is going to be a great experience for some to learn to sew, some to learn to make quilts, some to provide the love each quilt will give to the small children, and for some to come to the church to have fellowship with other quilters. When school is out over the summer, I pray God will nudge the younger ones among us who want to learn to sew to come learn something new and have fun while learning!
