#### The Spirit at Work

My Journey to Azle by Ray Gilman, M.Div. Senior Pastor, First Methodist Church

"I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well" (Psalm 139:14, NRSV).

Many people prefer to determine their own path in life. I felt that way myself when I was younger. I consider myself a self-made man. It makes me laugh now to remember. Looking back, I was rarely in charge of anything. Chaos was more likely the rule of the day.

In 2008, I joined in on a teaching mission to Uganda. I thought I knew what to expect. We were there to help others walk with Christ. Little did I know the mission had a purpose for me. Suffice it to say, the LORD claimed me in Africa. I was "ordained" in the jungle in a particular corn stalk and mud-walled "church" where a "fire" swept over me.

My life changed, and I eventually became a UMC Pastor in 2012. I walked away from an advertising career into the unknown. I surrendered to the LORD's call to go wherever Christ commanded. For 11 years I diligently served in the Upper New York conference of the UMC around Western and Central New York. The experience was far more "institutional" than I expected. Sadly, office politics often clouded any vision of God. I frequently prayed for a great movement of the Holy Spirit to turn our hearts to him. "Come, Lord Jesus! Come quickly, come now!"

In January of 2023, I took a solitary mission trip to Havana, Cuba, to assist a spirit-filled church. It was a blessing to step away from "busyness" and encounter the LORD directly. I was inspired to "let go of life" even more. I came back to the U.S. ready to cast everything to the wind and scared my wife and family. My life was changing again.

After much prayer and reflection, conversation and tears, my wife and I

decided to sell all that we had and follow God's lead. I was unanimously selected as the preferred candidate by the Staff Parish Council to be the Senior Pastor of First Methodist Church of Azle. So, here we are in Texas. God had his way with all of us it seems.

Now begins the work of formation. As a new congregation in the Global Methodist Church, we are blessed to share our faith and use our spiritual gifts within the community. The Holy Spirit has brought us all together. We strive to grow into a harmonious community. A place where people can see glimpses of the Kingdom of God. A place where we can live out an open expression of a "lived theology" in which values, beliefs, and practices are held in common. A place where every member is encouraged to share creatively and be part of the church's work and communal life. I look forward to bearing witness to the Spirit at work right here in Azle, Texas.

May you also know blessings this year. In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him."

## ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD RETREAT

Fourteen members of the Administrative Board and Staff met for a Saturday retreat at 10 am on February 24, 2024, at the lovely One Azle facility on Commerce Street. The first two hours were filled with a time of Sharing, Listening, Meditating, Reflecting, and Rest. Pastor Ray introduced us to *Lectio Divina*, which is a traditional way to read and reflect upon the scriptures. We read passages from Psalm 139 and John 15. It was a special time together.

After a delightful lunch from Simply Southern Catering (highly recommended!), we launched

into the business of the afternoon. Pastor Ray gave us a presentation on Visioning and Missional Alignment. As he told us, "We are going to crack a lot of eggs today, but we are not making any omelets!" It was familiar material to those with a business background, but very helpful from a church perspective. We are aiming for Missional Alignment where everyone and everything are moving together. To achieve this, we as a congregation will be identifying our 3-5 key values. We will identify our Mission, give it a Context, and then apply our Mission and Context to our Church Vision. Unlike our Mission Statement, a church vision is not static but changes over time through a continual discernment process.

After a period in which we identify our church vision, the next part of the process will be developing S.M.A.R.T. goals as a congregation, in our ministries, and as individuals. S.M.A.R.T. goals are Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-Bound. There will be a 4-D process for doing so in which we Discover, Dream, Design, and then Do in a circular fashion.

After a time of teaching, we had "state of the church" briefings from areas: six Building/Trustees (Kent Meyerhoeffer), Welcome/Hospitality (Pastor Ray), Committee Organization (Brett Laaser), Music/Worship (Grant Newman & Pastor Ray), Youth/Mission Cox & Pastor (Kim Ray), and Children/Education Ingle). (Marsha finished up right on time at 3 pm, refreshed and renewed with a vision for the next steps as we fully embrace our new path as a church within the Global Methodist Church.

#### **CONFIRMATION**

Confirmation classes are underway with 22 confirmands under the tutelage of Pastor Ray. They are studying The Absolute Basics of the Christian Faith as well as A Catechism of Christian Faith and Doctrine for the Global Methodist Church. The class meets on Sunday afternoons from 4:00-5:30 pm. Confirmation Sunday will be on Sunday, May 19 which is also Pentecost Sunday. Please be in prayer







for these young people as they learn and grow in their faith.
